A short time later I was granted a full-time teaching assistantship which would cover the full cost of my education for my Master's in Music Performance. Here at Austin Peay, I have had the incredible opportunity to perform for world-class teachers, such as Dr. Lisa Wolynec, William Bennett, and Lorna McGhee. Additionally, I have begun my teaching career here with numerous private students and classes. Without the grant from Friends of Flutes, I would not have been able to afford the costs of travelling and audition expenses, and I may not be where I am today as a musician."
